Life Group Questions for the week of February 18, 2018

- 1. Looking back at your notes from this Sunday's message, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged or confused you?
- 2. This Sunday we saw Paul's concern that the Galatian Christians were regressing back to slavery under the Old Testament law. A life of freedom in Jesus can only be achieved by staying connected to him. What help do the following verses offer us for staying connected in our relationship with Jesus?

Psalm 139:23-24: James 4:17: Matthew 5:23-24: Romans 12:18

Can you think of anything from these verses that you could start or stop doing to help you stay consistently connected to Jesus?

3. The purpose of God's commandments has been misunderstood over time and yet still passed on in church and in homes. As we grow more in our faith and understanding of God's word, we have the opportunity to help family and friends more closely align with God's truth. How does Deuteronomy 6:1-9, 24-25 help us better understand how to apply the principles of the 10 Commandments (Exodus 20:1-17) in our lives?

What actions does God want the people to take in the verses above and how do they still apply to us today?

4. Read Galatians 4:8,9. Paul reminds the Galatians that they had been serving idols/false gods before coming to Christ. Many are unaware that an idol (aka "other god") can be anything in life that we've made more important than God. As you read through the following list, write down how each could become an idol. Next, read through the corresponding verses and jot down any truths or new insights that might help someone deal with an idol in their life.

How might these disciplines help you personally if you were to focus on doing them with the right motives? Can you think of any other spiritual disciplines you incorporate into your week? If so, what are they and how do they help you?
