Share a time when you found yourself in conflict with others due to the mixing of faith and politics.

Why does Matthew tell us in verse 22.15 that the Pharisees and the Herodians were testing Jesus together? What does this tell you about the political climate around Jesus?

What is significant about the question of paying the head tax to Caesar? E.g., Why ask that question? What did they hope to accomplish?

How does Jesus' response to the question give us an example of how we should respond to issues of politics?

What do you find difficult in the response of Jesus? E.g., What will be hard for you to copy in your own life?

Do you find your political perspective to be a.) black and white, or b.) shades of grey? Why?

Do you find that the political climate of our culture guides your thinking more, or is your thinking guided by the scriptures more? Why?

Do you see a strong secular/sacred divide, or do you see no division? Why?

What, if anything, should you change in your life as a result of this passage? When will you start this change?

Who do you know that needs to hear the truth of this passage? When will you tell them?

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
